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## South Bibb All Stars Make History with State Championship & World Series

The South Bibb All Stars 10U Softball Team advanced to the World Series after competing in a tournament on July 3-5 in Albertville. They've had an impressive season that saw the team make history.

Made up of 12 players, the team captured the Alabama State Championship, becoming the first softball team in South Bibb history to earn the title. The All Stars finished the season undefeated with a 15-0 record while outscoring opponents 132-18.

Their success came after months of dedication and hard work. The team practiced every day except Sunday, often spending several hours on the field regardless of the weather. The players said practicing in the rain was especially challenging but ultimately helped prepare them for game-day conditions during the summer season.

To prepare for practices and games, the team developed a pre-practice chant



that helped build confidence and strengthen team morale. One player also shared that listening to the song "Church Clap" before games helped her get

focused and ready to compete.

Beyond their success on the field, the players emphasized the close friendships they developed

throughout the season. They said practicing never felt like working because they were spending time with one another, making the experience both

enjoyable and memorable.

The coaches are Larry Clark, Jeremy Allen, Brons Anderson, and Scott Taylor. They expressed their

appreciation for the support they received from parents, fans, and the South Bibb community throughout the season, noting that the encouragement played an important role in the team's success.

The team plans to celebrate its historic season with a championship party. Details about the celebration have not yet been announced.

The RSA Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail is Helping Alabama Become a Move-In State

Dr. David Bronner is revered by our Alabama governmental employees, especially retired state workers. Dr. Bronner has overseen the administration and investments of the Retirement Systems of Alabama (RSA) for 53 years. To say that he has done a spectacular job would be a very pronounced understatement.

Dr. Bronner has been a genius as an investor and innovator. However, his most innovative venture was the creation of the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. It was one of the most win, win ventures ever seen with tax dollars. First of all, it is one of the state's largest tourists' attractions. Secondly, it made money the first year and has grown exponentially every year for over 40 years.

Mark Fagan, the outstanding spokesperson for the magnificent golf trail, wrote a book published by New South Books a decade ago entitled, "The Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail – It's History and Economic Impact." It is a beautiful coffee table masterpiece. The book documents, in script and photos, the Retirement Systems of Alabama's Golf Trail. Included is an in depth economic analysis of the impact of this historical project. There has been no other development activity in Alabama over the last 40 years that has contributed more to the history, economy, and image of the entire state than the golf trail project.

The pension funds RSA investment, a string of elite golf courses and affiliated high-end hotels and spas, in business-speak, was an economically targeted investment. It was designed to diversify returns and create jobs. It has done more than that. It has significantly increased Alabama's infrastructure for tourism and conventions, provided millions upon millions in tax revenues, it has enhanced our state's image, and helped persuade other businesses to locate in the state.

In the December issue of the RSA newsletter, Mark Fagan highlights the continued importance of the RTJ Golf Trail and how it is helping Alabama become a move-in state. Fagan explained how in 1990, U.S. retirees were one-fourth of the population, yet owned 77% of the personal financial assets. These retirees accounted for 70% of pleasure travel dollars. Many were migrating to other states for retirement, and their

spending was creating jobs in real estate, financial services, healthcare, recreation, insurance, and retail, while not causing a negative strain on the state education system, social services, criminal justice system, or environment. This positive economic impact attracted many towns and states to recruit these retirees to their area.

Tourism areas were evolving into retirement areas, and retirees were becoming permanent tourists in their area of relocation. Thus, in 1990, the RSA had the foresight to begin the development of world-class golf courses and hotels to attract tourists and retirees and improve the quality of life to promote corporate expansion in Alabama. These 26 public golf courses were designed by Robert Trent Jones, Sr. and became known as The Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail.

The Trail has evolved into 11 golf complexes, with 8 resort hotels, 6 world-class spas, 2 complete resort communities, and numerous restaurants/lounges

In 1995, the RSA began marketing the Trail nationally by purchasing over 45 television stations and 100 local newspapers. These investments provide the RSA with millions of dollars of free advertising each year to promote the Trail and other Alabama attractions. Without this media acquisition, the cost of these ads for the last 30 years would have totaled more than \$1 billion. As a result of the advertising, millions of people from all 50 states and over 20 countries have visited Alabama to play golf on the Trail.

According to the United Van Lines 48th Annual National Movers Study of inbound/outbound states for 2024, Alabama has moved up the list of higher-percentage inbound mover states since 2002. As of 2024, Alabama has reached number 6 on the list of states with the highest percentage of inbound movers. Each retiree household moving into Alabama has the same positive economic impact on the state as almost 4 factory jobs.

## "Day by Day"

Few hymns express quiet confidence in God's daily provision as beautifully as "Day by Day." Written in 1865 by Swedish hymn writer Karolina "Lina" Sandell-Berg, the beloved hymn has comforted Christians for generations with its message of trusting God one day at a time.

Born on October 3, 1832, in Sweden, Lina Sandell was the daughter of a Lutheran pastor. Her life changed forever at the age of 26 while traveling with her father to Gothenburg. During the journey, the ship suddenly lurched, causing her father to fall overboard. Tragically, he drowned before Lina's eyes.

Out of that profound grief came a remarkable outpouring of faith. Rather than allowing sorrow to consume her, Sandell began writing hymns that reflected a simple, childlike trust in Christ and a deep assurance of His constant presence. Among those treasured hymns was "Day by Day."

The hymn's opening words capture its central message: "Day by day, and with each passing moment,

Strength I find, to meet my trials here."

Throughout the hymn, Sandell reminds believers that God provides exactly what is needed for each day, blending both joy and hardship according to His perfect wisdom. The hymn echoes the promise found in Deuteronomy 33:25, "As thy days, so shall thy strength be," a verse woven directly into the second stanza.

The comforting melody was composed by Swedish musician Oskar Ahnfelt, whose music helped bring Sandell's heartfelt words to congregations across Scandinavia and eventually around the world.

Today, "Day by Day" continues to encourage Christians facing uncertainty, reminding them that faith is not always about knowing what tomorrow holds, but about trusting the One who walks beside them today. Born from personal tragedy, the hymn stands as a lasting testimony that even in life's darkest moments, God's presence remains constant, offering fresh strength, mercy, and peace with each passing day.

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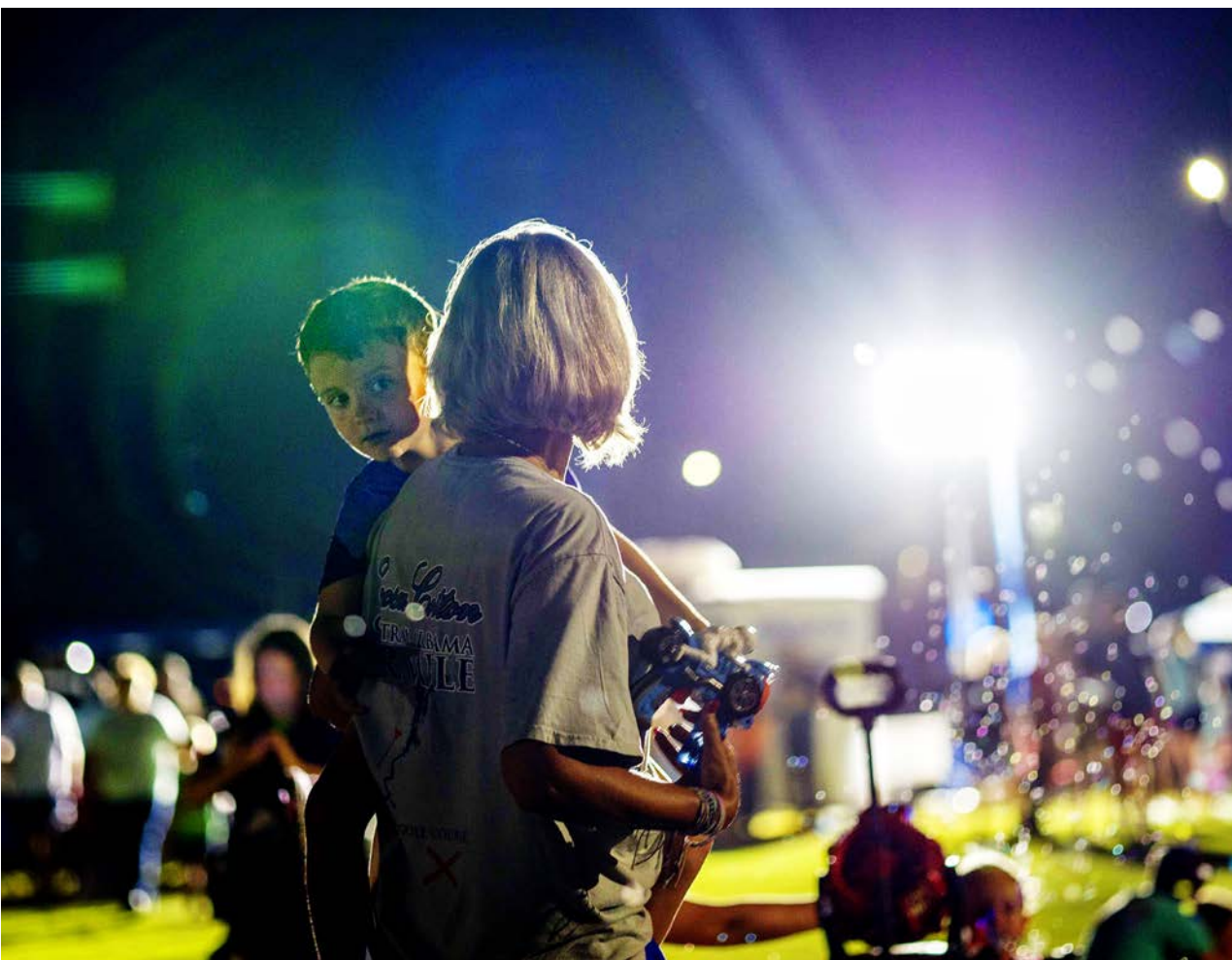

Bibb County Farm Swap Brings Community Together Twice Each Month

In many rural communities, some of the best conversations happen long before noon: over the tailgate of a truck, beside a table of homegrown vegetables, or while admiring a well-raised flock of chickens. The Bibb County Farm Swap brings that tradition to life by giving local residents a place to gather, buy, sell, trade, and simply enjoy spending time with others who share a love for farming, homesteading, and country living.

Held on the first and third Saturday of each month, the next Farm Swap is scheduled for Saturday, July 18, from 8 a.m. until 1 p.m. at 24301 Highway 5 in Woodstock.

Visitors can expect to find a wide variety of farm-related items, including livestock, farm supplies, eating and hatching eggs, fresh vegetables, baked goods, local honey, canned goods, plants, tools, antiques, arts and crafts, and much more. Whether

someone is searching for supplies, looking to sell homegrown products, or simply enjoys browsing, the event offers something for everyone.

Organizers say the goal is to create more than just a marketplace. The Farm Swap is intended to be a welcoming gathering place where neighbors can fellowship, meet other like-minded individuals, and enjoy a family-friendly atmosphere. To help maintain that environment, organizers ask everyone to treat one another with respect and note that drama will not be tolerated.

There are no vendor setup fees, making it easy for local growers, crafters, and farmers to participate. Vendors are also asked to clean their areas before leaving and be considerate of others when choosing a setup location.

Animal welfare is another priority. All animals must be healthy, properly housed with food, water, and bedding, and provided with shade during the hot summer months.
